

#### LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



#### Dear Friends of Hoag:

There was a palpable excitement when philanthropists Julia and George Argyros made a surprise appearance at the annual Hoag Nurse's Day Luncheon to announce an unprecedented gift to support nursing scholarships at Hoag.

With humor and poignancy, Julia shared the couple's passion for supporting nurses. She went on to announce their intention to commit \$10 million in cumulative giving to assist Hoag nurses in meeting their educational goals. I was touched by the story of how she connected with the nurses who treated George during his recuperation from a recent procedure. She was inspired by their personal stories and also reminded of her sister's long career as a dedicated nurse.

After the gift announcement, Hoag nurses lined up to personally thank and hug both Julia and George. As many of you know, this isn't the first time the couple has supported nursing education at Hoag. In 2013, their gift of \$2.5 million was the largest ever made to Hoag nursing at that time. It allowed Hoag to increase annual scholarship awards from \$2,000 to \$6,000 for each nurse scholar.

One key statistic eloquently tells the story of the impact of their generosity. Today, 59 percent of Hoag nurses hold a BSN or higher degree – up 11 percent since the \$2.5 million commitment. This simply would not have happened without the visionary support of Julia and George and our *Choose Nursing*, *Choose Hoag* donors.

In this special edition of *Scanner*, you will read a few excerpts from the many thank-you letters that have poured in from nurse scholarship recipients expressing their deep gratitude and appreciation. I know that when Hoag nurses walk by the Julia Argyros Center for Nursing Excellence seals, posted in places of honor throughout Hoag campuses, they feel a personal connection to an extraordinary woman who truly cares about them, their dreams and their goals to serve their patients.

Please join me in thanking visionary donors, Julia and George Argyros, for their years of generosity to Hoag. Hoag Unveils the "Julia Argyros Center for Nursing Excellence" Seal to Recognize the Argyros Family as the Largest Donors to the Nursing Scholarship Program in Hoag History

Hundreds of nurses at Hoag Hospital Newport Beach and Hoag Hospital Irvine enjoyed Hoag's annual Nurse's Day celebrations on May 5 and May 12, 2016. The décor was 1930s art deco, cruise liner chic and the food was fabulous. But the real treat was the surprise revelation by special guests, Julia and George Argyros. Cheers and thunderous applause followed the couple's announcement of their latest gift and the presentation of a \$10 million ceremonial check representing their cumulative giving to expand nursing scholarships for Hoag nurses.

A highlight of the luncheon was the unveiling of the Julia Argyros Center for Nursing Excellence seal, which will permanently commemorate the Argyros' generosity to Hoag. The seal is now proudly displayed throughout Hoag campuses. ## 2016 Hoag Nurse of the Year
