

Supporting Orange County's Young Scholars

The Toshiba Classic Scholarship is a charitable fund which provides two \$10,000 scholarship grants and Toshiba laptop computers to selected outstanding Orange County high school seniors. Toshiba America Information Systems, Inc. and Hoag Charity Sports are once again extending their community outreach with the Toshiba Classic Scholarship Fund.

This year's program will consist of awarding one Toshiba laptop computer to the finalists from each

2015 Toshiba Classic Thrills Fans while Benefiting Hoag and the Greater Community

Golf fans on the course, and those watching from home, enjoyed another great Toshiba Classic set in a classic Newport Beach venue. One day after tying the tournament record with an 11-under-par 60, Duffy Waldorf closed with a 5-under-par 66 to claim his first Champions Tour title, holding off players like Fred Couples and Kenny Perry. After his win, Waldorf called Newport Beach his favorite golf course in Southern California.

In addition to its status as a first-class golf tournament, the Toshiba Classic is a platform for Toshiba to support health care, children and education in our community. Toshiba is the longest-running title sponsor on tour, and the Toshiba Classic is well known as the most charitable event on the PGA Champions Tour.

2015 marks the 18th year that Hoag has been the event manager, host and primary beneficiary of this renowned event. Consistently raising \$1 million each year for Hoag, the Toshiba Classic







has benefited health care in our community in ways that are incalculable. Since 2011, proceeds have benefited the Mary & Dick Allen Diabetes Center at Hoag.

Toshiba Classic Helps Families Coping with Diabetes

Mary & Dick Allen Diabetes Center at Hoag

Through the generous support of the Toshiba Classic and other donors, the Mary & Dick Allen Diabetes Center offers critical, but non-reimbursable services to thousands of patients and families throughout Orange County. We are proud of the Center's achievements in helping people live full and healthy lives including:

- The Ueberroth Family Program for Women with Diabetes, Sweet Success: Expectant mothers with diabetes prior to pregnancy, and those diagnosed with gestational diabetes, benefit from pre-conception family planning and diabetes education, as well as ante-partum and postpartum glucose management. The program has been responsible for lower macrosomia (large baby weight) rates among patients–6.6 percent at Hoag versus the national average of 10 percent; and a reduced rate of post-pregnancy diabetes (36.1% in 2015 vs. a national average of 60%).
- The Herbert Family Program for Young Adults with Type 1 Diabetes: There are a myriad of concerns that are addressed through the program including the financial, psychosocial, social and physical impacts of diabetes. With higher rates of depression among teens with diabetes than in the general population, and other unique challenges such as diabulimia (the misuse of insulin for weight control), mental health is a critical priority. The "First Fridays" program allows participants to gather in a social setting to share experiences, advice and support.

- The Sweet Life Community Education Program:
 The success of the cooking classes offered through the Sweet Life Community Education Program has exceeded all expectations, with up to 120 people attending each session. Management of diabetes does not mean suffering through tasteless food. Participants learn delicious recipes in hands-on classes.
- The Allen Diabetes Center in collaboration with CHOC Children's (CHOC): The CHOC Children's Clinic offers pediatric endocrinology care, education and support services for children with, and at risk for, diabetes and their families. CHOC Children's and the Allen Diabetes Center also work with a wide array of community agencies such as the Newport-Mesa Unified School District, Share our Selves, Latino Health Access, American Diabetes Association and Families Costa Mesa to support the prevention of pediatric obesity and diabetes in the community.
- Prevention of Obesity and Diabetes through Education Resources (PODER): Provided through CHOC Children's, Hoag offers no-cost diabetes and obesity prevention education programs, cooking classes and Zumba exercise classes.
 PODER and PADRE (Pediatric Adolescent Diabetes Research Education Foundation) provide support to patients with Type 1 diabetes and to their families through events and educational workshops.
